Parent Perception Survey

In Spring 2013, the Center for Parenting and Family Well-Being surveyed parents to better understand their perceptions of parent education, barriers to participation, and the types of classes they would like to attend. Parents were primarily recruited through Spring Branch ISD and the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston and 1,196 parents completed the survey. The survey was offered in English and Spanish.

Attending parenting classes

- 28% of participants reported having attended a class, workshop, or seminar focused on parenting.
- 55% of participants believed that all parents should attend a parenting class but only 33% of those had attended a parenting class themselves.

Seeking parenting advice

Parents seek parenting advice from a variety of sources. Parents are most likely to seek advice from their parenting partner (69%). Only 11% parents attend a parenting class when they need parenting advice.

Format of parenting classes

Parents are most interested in attending a small group parenting classes and least interested in attending individual sessions.

Topics

Parents are interested in attending parenting classes that address a variety of topics. Parents are most interested in learning about ways to encourage their children (90%).

The name of the parenting class

Parents reported no differences in the likelihood they would attend a parenting class based on the name of the parenting class.

Addressing barriers to participation

Location, childcare, and costs are the most important factors to consider when addressing barriers to participation.
